This is a relatively short coastal walk to a low-lying headland overlooking the North Sea.

## Route guide

- 1) Start at the small car park just before the farm of Upper Cornquoy (HY5248 0018)
- 2) Go through the gate to head east along a narrow grassy track between fields to reach the coast (HY5265 0010)
- Turn right to head south along the coast and pass through a farm gate onto open heathland (HY5278 9967)
- 4) Follow the coast roughly southwest then south for approximately 700m to reach the low mound of North Cairn (ND5262 9916)
- **5)** Continue to follow the coast southeast to arrive at the prominent stone tower (ND5229 9882)
- 6) Carry on a further 200m to reach the small, modern lighthouse (ND5213 9865)
- **7)** Return to the start via the outbound route

## Make sure you follow our guide to being a responsible visitor:



Pick up litter, taking it home with you or using any bins provided.



Keep your dog on a lead around farmland and livestock, and clean up after pets too.



Avoid lighting fires or BBQs on moorland or in the countryside, and if you do have a BBQ or bonfire on a beach, please clean up afterwards.
