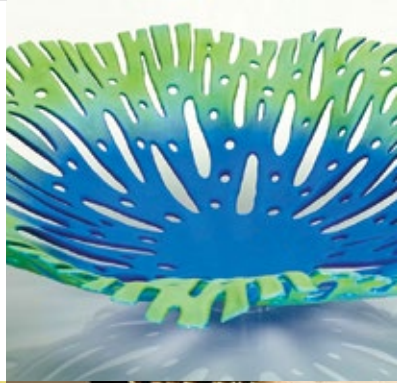

The Creative Trail makes it easy to discover some of the amazing arts and crafts people and designers that thrive in these inspirational islands - and at the same time helps you explore some of the sensational landscapes that make our beautiful islands so unique.

Founded in 1991 Creative Orkney is run by its members, each of whom produce quality art, craft and design pieces – all created here in the county.

Many have studied their discipline to a high level, and several have over 20 years' experience of working and exhibiting their pieces within the creative sector.

In 1995, the original Orkney Crafts Association created the Orkney Craft Trail. Renamed the Creative Orkney Trail it leads visitors to workshops, where they have the chance to talk directly to makers and to find out how their products are made.

It really is a window into the life, skills and work environment of the people who make these inspiring and beautiful products.

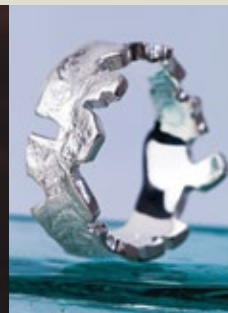

After graduating in Jewellery & Metal Design from Dundee's Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art & Design in 2013, Zoe interned with Iris Van Herpen in Amsterdam and jeweller Gilly Langton in Plockton before working with two Orkney-based jewellery companies. She launched her own business in 2016, and in 2019, she earned several accolades, including a Bronze award at Scotland's Trade Fair and a nomination for the '30 Under 30 Rising Star Awards' in Retail Jeweller.

Beyond her signature collections, Zoe specialises in bespoke jewellery, including remodelling cherished pieces, creating bold statement designs, and crafting engagement and wedding rings tailored to individual stories.

From Stromness: take the A965 and turn left after Maes Howe. Wind along the lovely Stoneyhill Road, and after just over 2 miles, turn left again for 209 metres.

Michael is an Orcadian who has been practicing the craft of woodturning for over 30 years, he is self-taught and has honed his skills using a combination of practice, experimentation and the desire to produce fine attractive pieces.

He was accepted onto the Register of Professional Turners (RPT) in 2017.

He specialises in unique one off pieces of woodturning. These pieces are heavily influenced by the Neolithic artifacts found here in the islands. He is now exploring iron age and Viking treasures which are also influencing his work, along with some nautical themes reflecting his past career at sea.

Hardwood logs are processed on site utilising a chainsaw and our own small sawmill. This gives Michael the greatest flexibility to cut the best blank for the piece he has in mind.

A mixture of modern, traditional and hand techniques are used to achieve the desired effect in the finished piece.

All this results in Michael creating unique pieces to enhance any setting.

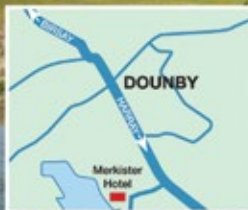

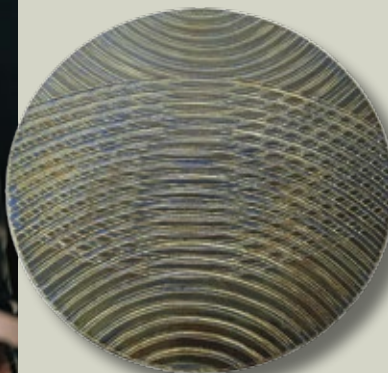

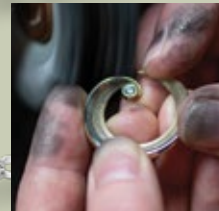

Traditionally made from driftwood found on the shoreline, their distinctive oat straw backs, often hooded, offered shelter from the draughts in old stone croft houses.
